# Student and Parent/Caregiver Rights and Responsibilities Policy



## **Policy Objectives**

To identify the rights and responsibilities of students and parents/caregivers of the Sacred Heart College community.

### **Policy Statement**

Sacred Heart College staff are required to conduct themselves in accordance with the Staff Code of Conduct Policy. This public document which is available at <a href="https://www.shc.sa.edu.au">www.shc.sa.edu.au</a> outlines the responsibilities and obligations of staff. Staff 'Rights' are detailed in Industrial Agreements and Work Health Safety Legislation.

This policy is presented to assist students and parents/carers to conduct themselves in harmony with the Sacred Heart College ethos which is based on a 'Family Spirit'.

### Student Rights and Responsibilities

#### Student Rights

- To be treated justly and to be valued as an individual.
- To feel safe and secure and to be free from discrimination and intimidation.
- To be provided with a safe and healthy College environment.
- To have a positive and supportive atmosphere that is conducive to learning.
- To be provided with a quality education that caters for individual differences in ability and talents and develops the whole person.
- To be afforded natural justice processes as required.

### Student Responsibilities

- To treat others justly and value them as individuals.
- To contribute to a safe and secure College that is free from discrimination and intimidation.
- To work together to maintain an environment which is safe, healthy and clean.
- To have a positive and responsible attitude towards learning and to respect the right of all students to learn.
- To promote and enhance a positive image of the College by observing all College rules.
- To cooperate with College staff in support of due processes.

## Parent / Caregiver Rights and Responsibilities

## Parent / Caregiver Rights

- To know that their children will be treated justly and be valued as an individual in the light of Christian values in the Marist tradition.
- To be kept informed of events occurring at the College through the various modes of communication.
- To be consulted via appropriate forums on relevant matters concerning their children and their education.
- To be heard through clearly identified College channels and have their opinions valued and respected in matters relating to their children's education, welfare and spiritual development.



#### Parent / Caregiver Responsibilities

- To work in partnership with the staff to ensure the best possible educational outcomes for their children.
- To inform the College of any matters (social, emotional, physical or learning) that may impact on their children's welfare.
- To support the College's programs in meeting the educative needs of their children.
- To cooperate with College Staff in support of due process.
- To meet their obligations in relation to all matters relating to their children's education as stated in the College Enrolment Policy.
- To ensure that their children attends school and in times of approved leave ensures their children completes any work/assessment that may be missed.
- To work with the College in the implementation of rules, regulations and procedures.
